

EX-PRESIDENTS FLEE FBI

Four armed men known to authorities as the "Ex-Presidents" have escaped again after attempting to rob a bank in Culver City, police have stated.

The infamous gang robbed the Assured Trust Savings Loan Bank shortly after 10:30 am yesterday. Eyewitnesses saw the quartet escaping with bags full of money.

The deputy CEO of the bank has yet to comment on how much money has been taken.

When the robbers jumped into their getaway car, they were fired upon by FBI agent Johnny Utah, who had been staking out the bank with his partner, Angelo Pappas.

The gang managed to escape the hail of gunfire in a stolen 1984 Lincoln Town Car, as the two FBI agents frantically tailed them.

A chase ensued between the Marina Freeway and the lot of Fox Hills Mall. The agents, however, were unable to catch the robbers.

California

used a gas pump as a flamethrower and torched the getaway car, burning all fingerprints and evidence.

The other three "Presidents" managed to steal a yellow 1969 Chevrolet Chevelle. As Reagan was surrounded by flames, agent Utah arrived and managed to tackle the madman to the floor.

Utah's partner, agent Pappas, soon arrived and shot at the Chevrolet as the three remaining gang members sped away, leaving their man behind.

Agent Utah wrestled with Reagan as the robber caught fire from the flames he had ignited. Reagan soon managed to get the better of the FBI agent and escaped on foot, fanning the flames from his tuxedo jacket.

Agent Utah chased after the ex-president again, but stopped after obtaining a knee injury. Reagan disappeared in the concrete river channel that flows through Culver City.
